Gospel Reading: (Matt 4:1-11)

All: Glory to you, O Lord

1 Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil.

- 2 He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was famished.
- 3 The tempter came and said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, command these stones to become loaves of bread.'
- 4 But he answered, 'It is written,
- "One does not live by bread alone,

but by every word that comes from the mouth of God."

- 5 Then the devil took him to the holy city and placed him on the pinnacle of the temple, 6 saying to him, 'If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down; for it is written, "He will command his angels concerning you", and "On their hands they will bear you up,
- so that you will not dash your foot against a stone."
- 7 Jesus said to him, 'Again it is written, "Do not put the Lord your God to the test."

- "Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him."
- 11 Then the devil left him, and suddenly angels came and waited on him.
