⁵ Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said,

⁶ in burnt-offerings and sin-offerings you have taken no pleasure.

⁷ Then I said, "See, God, I have come to do your will, O God" (in the scroll of the book it is written of me).'

⁸ When he said above, 'You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt-offerings and sin-offerings' (these are offered according to the law), 9 then he added, 'See, I have come to do your will.' He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. ¹⁰ And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

Move my feet so that I am in the place where you want me to be


So I can bump into the people you want me to meet
