OLD TESTAMENT READING: Job 38:1-11

Then the Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind:

- ² "Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge?
- ³ Gird up your loins like a man,

I will question you, and you shall declare to me.

- ⁴ "Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding.
- ⁵ Who determined its measurements—surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it?
- ⁶ On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone
- ⁷ when the morning stars sang together and all the heavenly beings shouted for joy?
- 8 "Or who shut in the sea with doors when it burst out from the womb?—
- ⁹ when I made the clouds its garment, and thick darkness its swaddling band,
- ¹⁰ and prescribed bounds for it, and set bars and doors.
- ¹¹ and said, 'Thus far shall you come, and no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stopped'?

NEW TESTAMENT READING: 2 Corinthians 6:1-13

6 As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. ² For he says,

"At an acceptable time I have listened to you, and on a day of salvation I have helped you."

See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! ³ We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, ⁴ but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, ⁵ beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; ⁶ by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, ⁷ truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; ⁸ in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; ⁹ as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see—we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; ¹⁰ as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

¹¹We have spoken frankly to you Corinthians; our heart is wide open to you. ¹²There is no restriction in our affections, but only in yours. ¹³In return—I speak as to children—open wide your hearts also.

GOSPEL READING: Mark 4:35-41

All: Glory to you, O Lord

³⁵ On that day, when evening had come, he said to them, "Let us go across to the other side." ³⁶ And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. ³⁷ A great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. ³⁸ But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" ³⁹ He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. ⁴⁰ He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" ⁴¹ And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?"

Psalm 107: 1-3 ,23-32

- O give thanks to the Lord, for he is gracious, for his steadfast love endures for ever.
- 2 Let the redeemed of the Lord say this, ◆ those he redeemed from the hand of the enemy,
- 3 And gathered out of the lands from the east and from the west, • from the north and from the south.
- 23 Those who go down to the sea in ships and ply their trade in great waters,
- 24 These have seen the works of the Lord ◆ and his wonders in the deep.
- 25 For at his word the stormy wind arose ◆ and lifted up the waves of the sea.
- 26 They were carried up to the heavens and down again to the deep; ◆ their soul melted away in their peril.
- 27 They reeled and staggered like a drunkard and were at their wits' end.

- 31 Let them give thanks to the Lord for his goodness and the wonders he does for his children.
- 32 Let them exalt him in the congregation of the people and praise him in the council of the elders.
